

# Budget 2015-16: Social Security Income Test – improve integrity of social security income test arrangements

**Information update:** Legislation for this Budget measure was passed and received Royal Assent on 30 June 2015.

# **Description of the measure**

The gross payment from a <u>defined benefit income stream</u><sup>[1]</sup>, less any deductible amount, is currently assessed as income under the social security income test.

From 1 January 2016, the income test deductible amount for defined benefit income streams will be capped at a maximum of 10% of gross payments.

Veterans' Affairs pensioners will not be affected and military defined benefit income streams will be exempt from the measure.

# Questions and answers

### Who will be affected by this measure

Customers on an income support payment, or who hold a Low Income Health Care Card, may be affected if they have defined benefit income streams.

The assessment of income for aged care fee purposes will also be affected.

## Who is eligible for this measure

Customers who have a <u>defined benefit income stream</u>[1] with a deductible amount currently more than 10%.

The 10% cap will be applied automatically and customers do not need to take any action.

### The date this measure will start and finish

This measure will start on 1 January 2016 and is ongoing.
